<ul> <li>Clean exhaust fans and filters to rid them of dust and debris that could pose a fire hazard</li> <li>Get your wood burning or gas fireplace and chimney inspected</li> <li>Check batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Prune trees with branches susceptible to breaking during a winter storm</li> <li>Inspect your roof and gutters to mitigate any issues from accumulating ice</li> <li>Keep walkways ice-free by always having salt and a shovel on hand</li> </ul>
Stay Healthy	
<ul> <li>Mold loves moisture, so fix any interior leaks</li> <li>Let some fresh air in to reduce the build up of toxins, like bacteria and dust</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Check vents between the indoors and the outside to ensure they are debris free</li> <li>If you let your car heat up in your garage, make sure the door between the garage and your home seals completely</li> </ul>

## Indoors or out, you can prevent your pipes from freezing in winter

- Insulate pipes by windows and doors, including those in the unheated parts of your home
- Disconnect your garden hose and winterize outside faucets using a hose bib cover
- □ If you have water supply lines in your garage, keep the garage door closed
- □ If you're headed out of town, leave the heat on in your home at a temperature no lower than 55°
